CHILDREN OF PROMISE

Galatians 4:21-23

Tell me, you who want to be under the law, are you not aware of what the law says? For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by the slave woman and the other by the free woman. His son by the slave woman was born in the ordinary way; but his son by the free woman was born as the result of a promise.

Paul is going to use the remainder of chapter 4 to use an actual historical event from the Old Testament to illustrate his point that grace is far superior to works. Such an illustration is called an allegory. Under inspiration of the Holy Spirit the Apostle Paul can allegorize parts of Scripture to illustrate a different point other than the one originally made by that part of Scripture. Those who allegorize Scripture today, however, force parts of Scripture to say something that they were not originally meant to say.

Today we meet the principle characters in this historical account. (Perhaps later this evening you would have time to read the account for yourself in Genesis 16). We all know Abraham. God made a special covenant with him. His descendants would inherit the Land of Canaan. His name would be great. His descendants would be as numerous as the stars in the sky. All nations on earth would be blessed through him (the Savior of the world would come from his family).

Three of those four promises that God had made to Abraham required that he have at least one child. At the age of 85 (his wife, Sarah, was 75) Abraham still had no children. Rather than putting his trust in the Lord to keep his promises, Abraham took matters into his own hands. He and his wife came up with a plan. They decided that Abraham should sleep with Sarah's maidservant, Hagar. Hagar could give Abraham his long-expected son. Hagar did have a son. His name was Ishmael. God told Abraham, however, that Ishmael was not the son of promise. He would have a son by his own wife. 15 years later Abraham and Sarah had that son. His name was Isaac. Those two sons - Ishmael and Isaac - are going to illustrate Paul's point in the remainder of this chapter.

A simple reminder to take home today is that it is always better to place our trust in God than to take matters into our own hands. If God has promised something, then he will do it; and he will do it in his own time. Consider the promise God made to Eve in the Garden that her Seed would crush Satan's head. It would be 4,000 years before that Seed, Jesus, would be born. We will hear Paul say later in this chapter, "When the time had fully come . . ." When it comes to our salvation, we don't take matters into our own hands. Our salvation is the result of Christ's outstretched hands on the cross. We trust in God for salvation. May we also trust in him for everything else.

PRAYER: *I am trusting thee, Lord Jesus, trusting only thee - trusting thee for full salvation, great and free. Amen.*

How exciting to see a full church, more than just at festival times of the church year! How edifying for our faith to hear the Word and let it motivate and direct our lives! What a blessing to see that happen to many, many others around us!

May this year's Easter joy fill all of our hearts with actions of love for God and neighbor!

Paul Kimble, nephew of Glenn and Lois Kimble presented a view of Puerto Rico after Hurricane Marie and the recovery initiatives in 2017, at Good Shepherd. Paul went over to Puerto Rico as a recovery initiative by Veterans Administration Organization and was assigned anything from transporting water from the warehouses to setting up outside clinics after the clinics were destroyed.

He had pictures of some of the devastation. 50,000 utility poles were pulled from the ground. 95% of all of Puerto Rico lost power and some still are without power after almost a year. There is a discrepancy in numbers as to how many citizens were deceased. The government said only 6, while the local authorities indicate that 1000 or more are lost due to the fact they are missing.

Puerto Rico relies on \$1.5 billion in tourism; and because of devastation of their infrastructure, they will not see that this year.

Following the presentation, we had a soup dinner; and fellowship was enjoyed by all. 30 people were in attendance

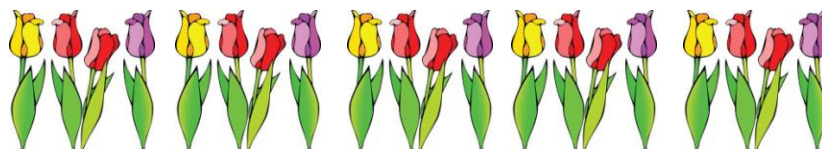
We had a great turnout for our March fellowship activity, going to see the movie "I Can Only Imagine." We hope everyone had a great time!

 - Type Fremont, SRA into the "Where do you want to explore" search bar and then select Fremont SRA from the drop down.
 - Click the blue "Check Availability" button on the next screen under Fremont SRA.
 - On the next screen, enter July 27, 2018 into the date field, and enter in the number of nights that you wish to stay in the "Length of Stay" field. Then click "Search Available"
 - We will use the campsite area as in the past, which is the "Pathfinder Campground Loop" between Lake 10 and Lake 16. Camper sites in this area are 1-10, 76-79 and tent sites 200-203.
 - Available sites will appear as blue icons, click on the available site you want.
 - Confirm your selection on the next screen
 - You will then need to either sign in or create an account to proceed with checkout.
