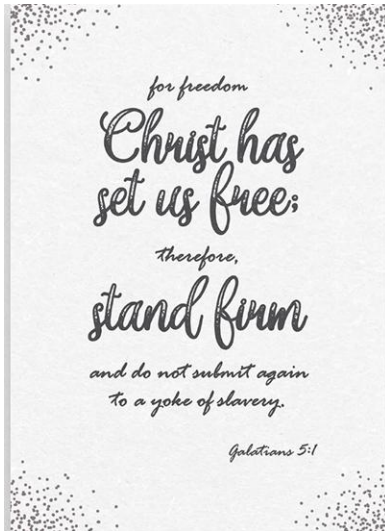

### STAND FIRM

Galatians 5:1-6

It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. Mark my words! I, Paul, tell you that if you let yourselves be circumcised, Christ will be of no value to you at all. Again, I declare to every man who lets himself be circumcised that he is obligated to obey the whole law. You who are trying to be justified by law have been alienated from Christ; you have fallen away from grace. But by faith we eagerly await through the Spirit the righteousness for which we hope. For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.

Paul said, “You who are trying to be justified by law have been alienated from Christ; you have fallen away from grace.” This is a serious claim on Paul’s part but there was too much at stake to soft step the issue. Paul couldn’t afford to sugarcoat his message. He couldn’t worry about offending anyone or hurting anyone’s feelings. He couldn’t stand idly by and watch people throw away God’s free salvation. His point is simple: “Give in on one small point, make one concession, and not only do the Judaizers win but Satan wins as well. Obligate yourself to one ritual or one good deed or one special law and be prepared to keep every single one of God’s laws for salvation.” Such a choice becomes ridiculous when Paul points out that neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value before Jesus anyway. Jesus never said, “Whoever believes and is circumcised will be saved.”

The only thing that matters is faith - faith in Christ that receives God’s free forgiveness. Note also what Paul said about this “receiving-faith.” It will show itself in action. Saving faith in Christ expresses itself - to God and to others - through love. It was James who said, “Faith without works is dead.” Paul here is saying that works follow faith. The Judaizers would say that works lead to faith. May we stand firm in the Gospel of free forgiveness and in the freedom that we have. May we use that freedom to express our faith in loving words and actions.

**PRAYER:** *Lord, forgive me for the times I have not only failed to love but also for the times I actually chose to hate. Amen.*

how you want to make your offering. You can make a one-time offering if you want, or you can create an account, and set it up to give on a regular basis. You can use your checking account, savings account, debit card, or credit card to make your offering. All major credit cards are accepted, including American Express. Also if you receive a gift card with a VISA or MasterCard logo on it, that should work as well.

Right now we have it set up for just giving to the general fund; but in the near future, you will also be able to give to the building fund or any other fund if you want to give for a specific purpose. Also in the near future, you will also be able to give your offering on the church's web site.
